As a senior staff member, the Director of Wildlife Management reports directly to the Executive Director of the NWMB, while supervising and managing a cross-cultural team of highly skilled individuals who are dedicated to achieving our vision of making Nunavut a world-class model for the cooperative management of healthy wildlife populations.

We are looking for a natural leader with superior interpersonal, analytical and communications skills who will bring their energy, imagination and initiative to the table, along with their dependability, flexibility and critical thinking skills. The successful applicant will have a passion for learning and leading, as well as a keen interest in wildlife management. A willingness to live, work and travel in a northern environment, along with sensitivity to Inuit and other Indigenous cultural values, is essential to excel in this position and be a trusted member of our team.

The Director of Wildlife Management:

- addresses a wide variety of issues and participates in a wide variety of activities related to wildlife management decisions and planning, research, and communications and public awareness
- works closely with NWMB staff, Board members, Inuit, government departments, co-management partners and other organizations concerning conservation and management issues affecting Nunavut's fisheries and wildlife
- reviews scientific and technical submissions and provides scientific and technical advice to the Board with respect to wildlife management
- communicates with a broad range of audiences on wildlife management issues

**Qualifications:** Our ideal candidate has a graduate degree in science or management of renewable resources, with experience in biological research or wildlife management preferred. He/she has demonstrated experience in wildlife management and knowledge of ecological principles, the interactions between wildlife populations and their habitats, as well as the legislation affecting wildlife management, and the use of wildlife resources in Nunavut. Experience in northern Canada and/or in other cross-cultural situations is a distinct asset. Superior knowledge of written and spoken English is essential, while the ability to speak and/or write Inuktitut and French would be a definite asset.
