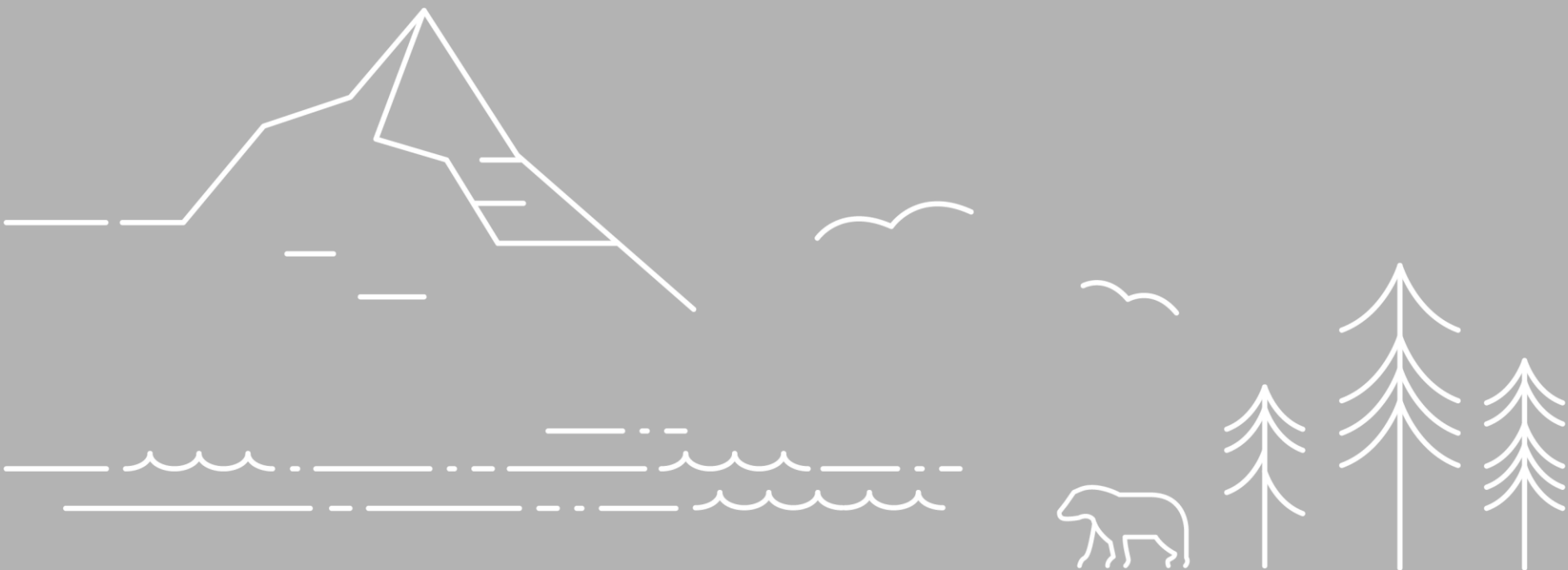

The Canada Nature Fund will provide \$444 million over 5 years, to be matched by partners, which will result in at least \$1 billion towards nature conservation in Canada.

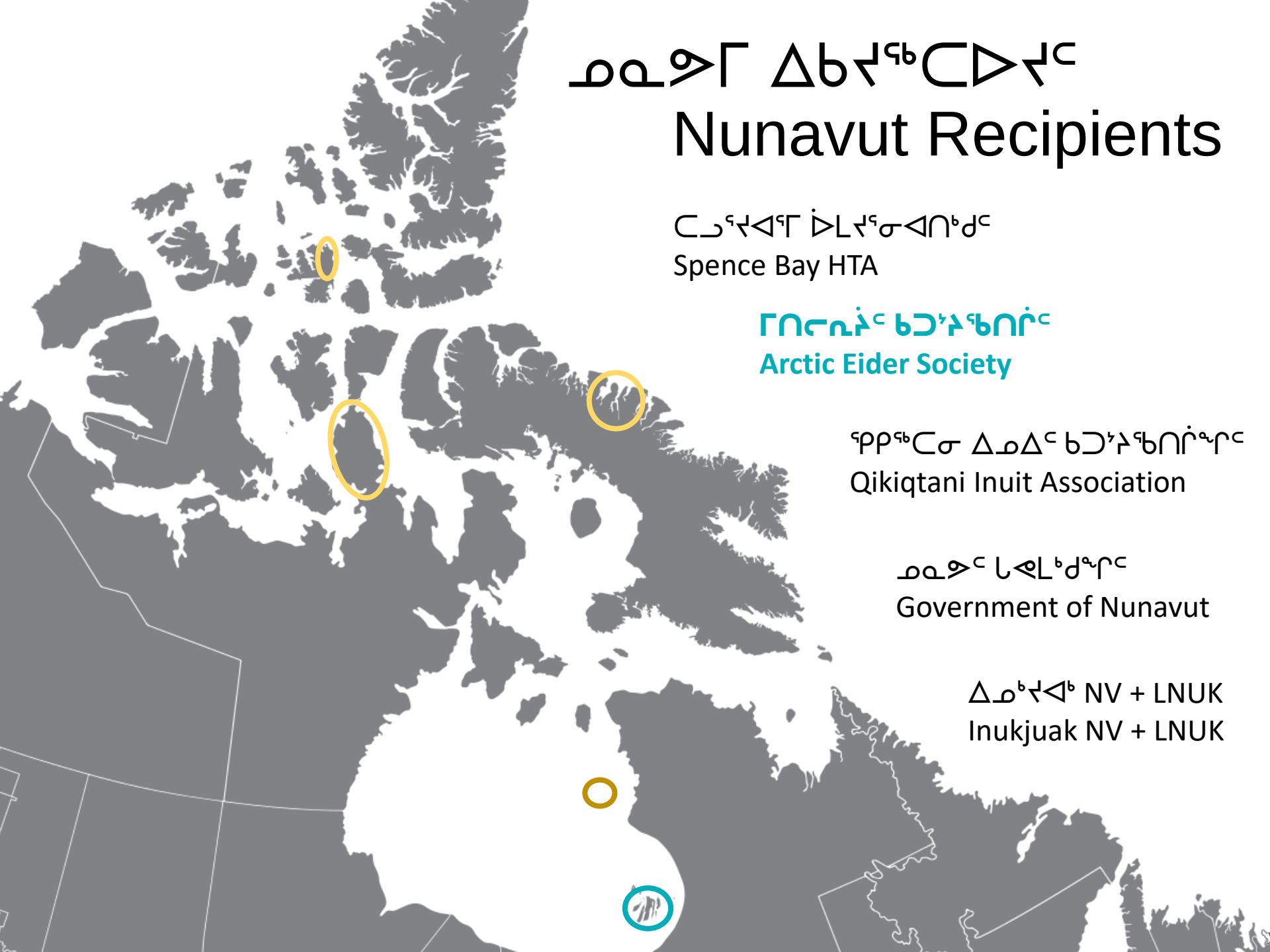

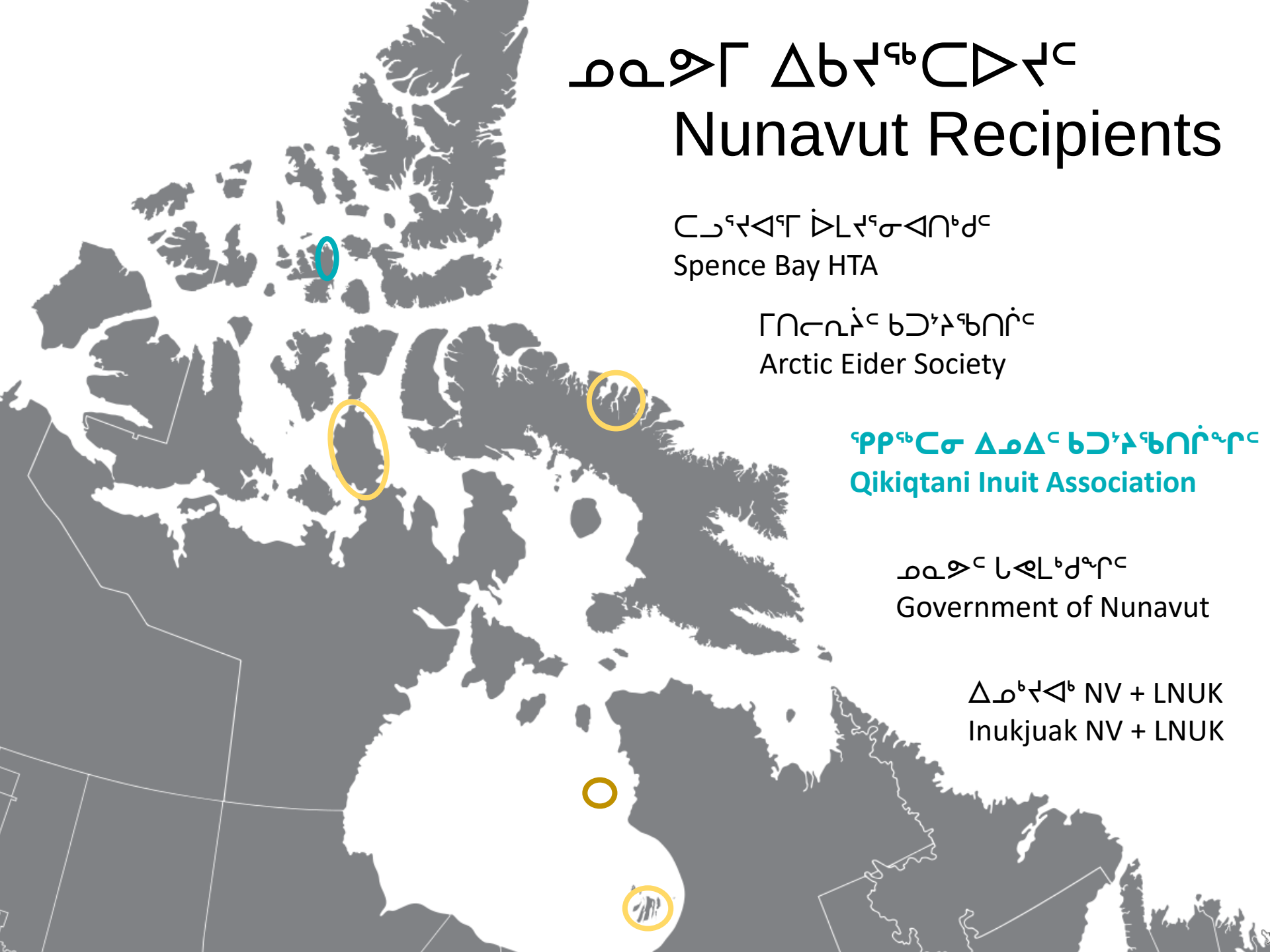

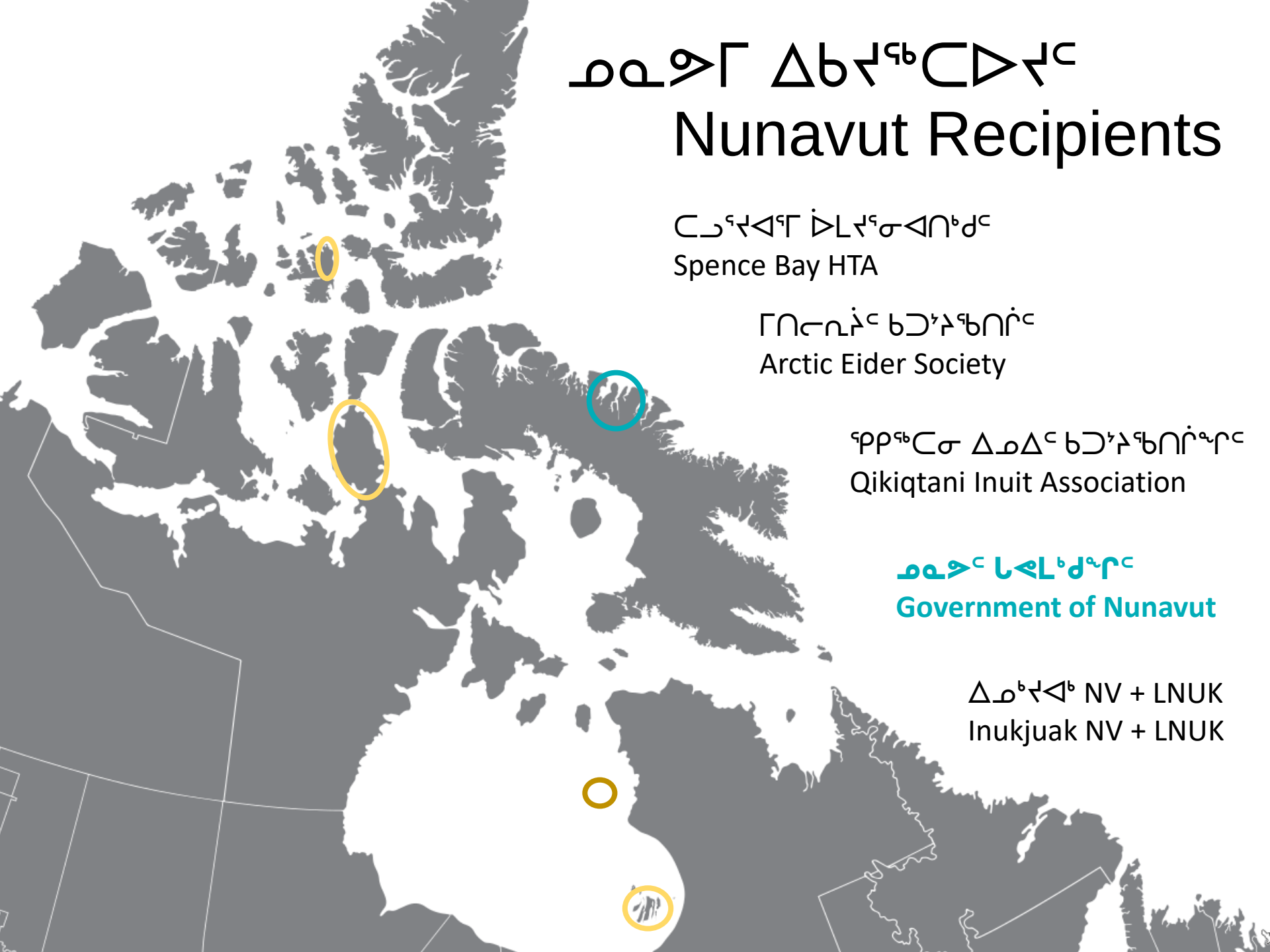
