









- III. The Management Plan does not propose any restrictions on Inuit harvesting in the park; and
- IV. The Joint Park Management Committee, consisting of three Kivalliq Inuit Association appointees and three Government appointees, reviewed and approved the draft Management Plan.

As per section 5.3.17 of the *Agreement*, the NWMB is hereby forwarding its Ukkusiksalik National Park of Canada Management Plan decisions to you for your review and consideration.
