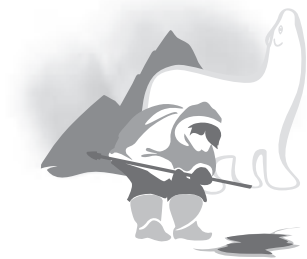





Anngayuqqap Uqauhigit

April 1 2005-mit March 31 2006-mut Nunavut Uyamayuliriyinut (NWMB) ukiunga pilirinalaumat allianialunilu, illagiyauyutlu havaqtitlu allanngulutik ukiuptinni. Hitamat katimayit illihimanigit iyulilaumanik, tallimak nutaat katimayit tiqataulutit (Anngayaq illauluni), havaktulu marruk illilutik, ammalu tapna akuni havaktuk, Josée Galipeau - NWMB umayunik qauyihakti- allanik pinahuaramaliluaqmat.

Nick Amautinuvar – tapna katimayiluaqtuq Kitikmeot Inuit Katujiqatiginut (KIA) tiqqatauhimalauqtuq – inangiqtaulauqmat October 2005-mi Makabe Nartokmik Kugaarukmitak. Robert Moshenkouq katimayiuvinga ihuliluaqniyuk NWMB-mi February 2006-mi. Robert tiqatauhimalauqtuq Kanataup Kavamagininik (GIC), Ministap Immaqmiutaliriyikunnik, kigaqtuiqulunigit inuimmat. Nutaanik GIC-kut tikuahiluaqngitut huli taphumunaga kakimayihamik attutiqayuaralutitilugu. NWMB-kut quyannamiktut angiyumik Nickmiklu Robertmiklu ukiunik hitamanik katimayiuviavauluninginik.

Harry Flaherty illiyaukaniluaqtuq katimayiuunikmut was February 2006-mi marugilikanganik Nunavut Tunngavik Timinganik (NTI), ammalu Kevin McCormick – tapna akuniulakmik katimayiuuyuk NWMB-kunik – illiyakanilaumiuyuk December 2005-mi GIC-kunik, Munagiyit Hulakyuanik Ministanganik hitamagilikanganik. Tapkua Harrylu Kevinlu katimayiuqataningit ikayutiqatianiutuk NWMB-kut hivumuatiarunaqnikmut.

Pingahulauqtut nutaat katimayingulauqtut 2005-2006mi: Makabe Nartok, Pitseolak Alainga ammalu uvanga, Joe Tigullaraq. Makabe, tapna KIA-kunik tiqatajuk, ayungitiatuq NWMBkunuk katimayiuunikmik, katimayiluaqmat 1997-mit 2001-mut. Pitseolak tikuatalauqtuq November 2005-mi GIC-kunik Nunaqaqaqtuliriyiqunuk Ministanganik uqaqatigalutik Commissioner-in-Executive Council-kunik. Angunahitimarik ammalu angayuqaangulauhimayuk Amarak Umayuliriyinik Iqalukni.

Uvangali, katimayiluktaat piquyanganik malikhutik, quviahulauqung August 2005-mi GIC-kunnik tikuatalaunira NWMB-kunik Angayuqaamut. Nakhaktaka tagyunga katimayiuunikmut 24-nik ukiunik umayuriririkmit Nunavumi ammalu Nunatsiakmi. Katimayiluktaaningalunga, tapna Harry Flaherty NWMB-kut katimayi anngayuqanguyaukalauninganik Umayuliriyinik angayuqaangulauqtinanga huli.

Kingulipaami, NWMB-kut quviaput ammalu tunngahuquyiyut magrunik nutaanik havaktinik - Dr. Joe Justus, NWMB-kut Hivumuriyi Umayuliriyinut, amma Erin Calder, umayunik qauyihatti. Tamamik ayungitiatuuk umayunik qauyihaknikmik, qauyimayaminik ammalu piyumanikmik tapkua illaliutitianiutuuk NWMB=kut havaktinik.

Tapkua nunaat katimayit ammalu havaktiit ilihimaliqtilugit, NWMB-kut ukiuluktaaq hivumuatiitiluaqput umayuliriniqmik amihunik. Tagva takuhaulualuaqtut: November 2005-mi, katimayit katimaqatigatigaluaqmata Aviktuqhimayuni Umayuliriyinik, Nunani Umayulirit ammalu ahiginik tamakuningat piliriaqaqtunik, uqauhigaluaqtut haqitaulauqtunik Tamaat Pilaaktiat Umayut (TAH) ammalu Kotaqangitut Keelingutait (NQL) Umayulirinuip maligakhanit pigiaquyayuyunik Nunavut *Umayunut Maligak* mikhaanut. Pagnagutit illuluaqqtut tapkua Umayuliriniqmut Maligakhait atuliqulugit ukiulaaqtimi, NWMB-kut tuhalauqtulugit inuknik ammalu angiqtaupata tiakkua keelihangit haqitauhimayut.

NAFO-kut hakitiluaqmata anginikhamik piyayunatut iqaluknik tiaplua qauyiharutaulauqtut malikhugit imakmi itiyumi – illanga akiliqtaulauqtuq qauyiharuti NWMB-kunnik. Katimayit angilauqtut NAFO-kut hivumuayaqyaniginik. October 2005-mi katimayit titirialuqtut Imaqmiutaliriyit Ministanganut tukhiraqhutit anginiqhamarimik piyumulutik Tamaat Pilaaktiat Umayunik Greenland turbotnik iqaluknik Nunavut imaaqutinganik qanigiyanganitunik. Ministagiyayuyuk tiulauqtuk anginiraqluni, angiligiaqtaulauqtuk 2,500 metric tonne-nik Nunavummiut iqalugunaqtanganik ukiutamaat, 2006-mi pigiaqluni.

Tautulugu Nunavut kinauyaliurigitig tariuqmi iqalugahunik piruqpalianinga, NWMB-kut piliriqatigaluaqmata Nunavut Kavamanginik, NTI-kunniklu ammalu Nunaqaqaqtuliriyikunnik akiliqtuiniqmik qauyiharutinik aulatnganik ammalu qannuq pivalianinginik tariutta hilataanittunik iqaluliriniup kinauyaliurutiit 2005-mi. Qauyiharutiup illanganik, NWMB-kut hivumuatiitigauktut August 2005-mi qauyihatiarahuqtut allangutititilutik piyayumaqtinik piquyanik iqaluknik kinauyaliuritikhanik. Katimayit niriukput tiapkua piquyakhat hivumuaraunaqhiniarahu giyaulutik 2006 nunnguani.

NWMB-kut kayuhinalauqtut ukiulimaag hivumuatiinnahulugu nutaanguyuk *Maligak Umayut Nungutuinarialit* (SARA) Nunavummi. June-lu December-lu 2005 akuningani, Kaitmayit hakkiyaaqtuqkut iyumaqaharutiqaluaqput iyumaliuqhutiqlu tiakungigat SARA-mut iliyayuyumayunut tuktuk taiyuyunik Peary Caribou, Dolphin amma Union Caribou ammalu piquqtunik tingiuyat atiqaqut Porsild's Bryum. Tiakua ihumalirutauyut hivumuatiitiluaqput Avatiliriyit Ministanganut piquyait *Nunatarutiit Angirutingat* maliqlugu. Tapna ukiurivyut umiktilugu, Minista huli kiulaungimat nammagiliginig, aagaqlunigit avalonik allangutitilugit NWMB-kut iyumaliangit.

Katimayit piliriaqalualuaqtut kinauyunik turaqtitilutik atutiqaluaqtinik umayunik qauyihaknikmik ukiunguyumi. April 2005-mi, NWMB-kut angihilauqput 21nik kavamakut qauhyarutinik tamakiit \$730,700, kinauyataqnaluaqtut Nunavut Umayunik Qauyihaqtinik Tuqquiyinuq (NWR). Atuatitkuttauq, NWR-kut angiluaqtut 7nik nunalikni qauyiharutinik NWMBkut Qauhyarutinginik akiqaqtunik Katimayit kinguniagut angililuaqtut \$85,000kanniqnik NWRtkut kinauyunik pingahunik qauyiharutinik hivumuatiitigatigatunik 2005-2006mi. Kingulipaaqli, March 2006mi NWMBkut angiluaqput \$581,835mik 18nut NWRtkut qauyiharutinik \$121,540nik NWMBkut Qauyiharutinik tukyirautinik – tamait hivumuniatunik ukiukanipkat. Nalunnangituk, NWMBkut umayut qauyihaqtauyariaqaninginik umayulirinialini Nunavummi – aglaat, atutiqamariktuk iyumaliuniaqluni nalinagitinik.

Ukiulimaami, NWMBkut qayihannaluaqtut qanuilikmangata qinalugiat Nunami Aulatinimik (CBM) atuqlutik nunalikni amihunik atuqyauyuk. 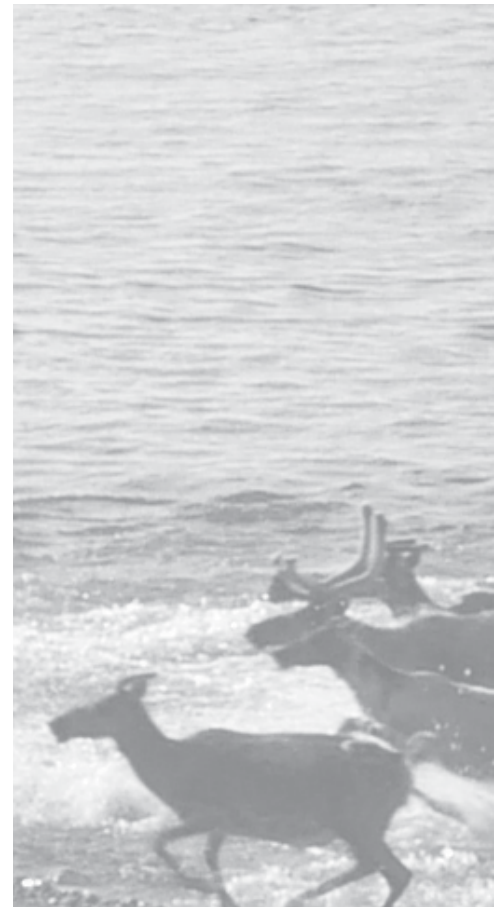





Message from the Chairperson

The period from April 1st 2005 to March 31st 2006 was another very busy and exciting year for the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board), with significant member and personnel changes during the fiscal year. Four of the Board members' terms expired, five member appointments (including that of the Chairperson) commenced, two new employees were hired, and a valuable long-term staff person, Josée Galipeau - the NWMB Wildlife Management Biologist – decided it was time to pursue other challenges.

Nick Amautinuvar - who served the Board effectively as the appointee of the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA) – was replaced in October 2005 by Makabe Nartok of Kugaaruk. Robert Moshenko's productive term as an NWMB member ended shortly thereafter, in February 2006. Robert was appointed by the Governor in Council (GIC), on the advice of the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, to represent the public interest. No new appointment has yet been made by the GIC to fill this important Board membership position. The NWMB sincerely thanks both Nick and Robert for four years of excellent service.

Harry Flaherty was re-appointed to the Board in February 2006 for a second term by Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI), and Kevin McCormick – the longest-serving member of the NWMB – was re-appointed in December 2005 by the GIC, on the advice of the Environment Canada Minister, for a fourth consecutive term. The invaluable experience of both Harry and Kevin will help to ensure the continued success of the NWMB into the future.

Three new members were appointed to the Board in 2005-2006: Makabe Nartok, Pitseolak Alainga and myself, Joe Tigullaraq. Makabe, the KIA appointee, is well qualified to take on his NWMB duties, having previously served as a productive Board member from 1997 to 2001. Pitseolak was appointed in November 2005 by the GIC on the advice of the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, in consultation with the Commissioner-in-Executive Council.

He is an accomplished hunter and former Chairperson of the Amarok Hunters and Trappers Association in Iqaluit.

As for myself, upon the recommendation of all the Board members, I was honored to be appointed in August 2005 by the GIC as the NWMB Chairperson. I bring to this position over 24 years of direct experience in wildlife management in Nunavut and the Northwest Territories. On behalf of the entire Board, I wish to thank NWMB member Harry Flaherty for so ably serving as the Board's Acting Chair in the period preceding my appointment.

Finally, the NWMB is pleased to welcome its two newest employees – Dr. Joe Justus, the NWMB's Director of Wildlife Management, and Erin Calder, the Board's new Wildlife Management Biologist. Both individuals are highly qualified biologists who, with their knowledge and enthusiasm, serve as ideal additions to the NWMB staff complement.

With its new appointments and added staff in place, a renewed NWMB spent the year carrying out a variety of important wildlife management activities. Among the highlights were the following:

In November 2005, the Board held a successful informal hearing involving all Regional Wildlife Organizations, Hunters and Trappers Organizations and other relevant co-management partners, concerning proposed Total Allowable Harvests and Non-Quota Limitations under the draft Wildlife Regulations and Orders made pursuant to Nunavut's new *Wildlife Act*. Plans are underway to bring the Wildlife Regulations and Orders into force in the next year, after the NWMB has completed its public consideration and approval of the proposed harvest limitations.

NAFO identified an increase in the sustainable yield of turbot based upon the results of recent deep sea fishery surveys - funded in part by the NWMB. The Board supported the NAFO recommendation. In October 2005 the Board wrote to the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans requesting a substantial increase in the Total Allowable Catch of Greenland Halibut (turbot) in the northern marine waters adjacent to Nunavut. The Minister responded positively, providing an additional 2,500 metric tonne allocation to Nunavut fishers annually, starting in 2006.

With the territory's commercial marine fisheries steadily expanding, the NWMB co-operated with the Government of Nunavut, NTI and the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development in financing an organizational and performance review of Nunavut's offshore fishing industry in 2005. In conjunction with that review, the NWMB commenced in August 2005 a thorough review and revision of its allocation policy for commercial marine fisheries. The Board expects to have in place a revised allocation policy by late 2006.

The NWMB continued throughout the year to help implement the new *Species at Risk Act* (SARA) in the Nunavut Settlement Area. Between June and December 2005, the Board publicly considered and made decisions concerning the proposed listing under SARA of Peary Caribou, Dolphin and Union Caribou and a northern moss named Porsild's Bryum. Those decisions were then forwarded to the Environment Canada Minister pursuant to the terms of the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement*. As of the end of the fiscal year, the Minister had not yet responded with an acceptance, rejection or variation of the NWMB decisions.

The Board was particularly devoted to funding important wildlife research during the fiscal year. In April 2005, the NWMB approved twenty-one government research projects, totaling \$730,700, to be funded from the Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust (NWRT). At the same time, the NWMB approved seven community research projects under the NWMB Studies Fund, in the amount of \$234,500. The Board later approved a further \$85,000 from NWRT funding for three additional projects to be undertaken in 2005-2006. Finally, in March 2006, the NWMB approved \$581,835 for eighteen NWRT projects, and \$121,540 for five NWMB Studies Fund research proposals – all to be carried out in the next fiscal year. Clearly, the NWMB views wildlife research to be a vital part of the wildlife management system in Nunavut - in fact, an essential tool in making informed decisions.

Throughout the year, the NWMB continued to successfully monitor the innovative Beluga and Narwhal Community-Based Management (CBM) Systems operating in several Nunavut communities. In addition, the Board considered a report

concerning the future of community-based management of beluga in Iqaluit and Kimmirut, and decided in April 2005 to approve the continuation of the CBM system in those two communities for a further trial period of three years (2005 to 2007). The Minister of Fisheries and Oceans accepted the NWMB's decision in July 2005.

The Board made numerous harvest limitation decisions during the year, including with respect to walrus, beluga, narwhal, char and polar bear harvesting. The NWMB also approved two essential plans for the management and protection of Bowhead whales. In July 2005, the Board approved the Naujaat Arviq (Bowhead Whale) 2005 Hunt Plan, and a successful hunt was then carried out in Repulse Bay in August. The NWMB later approved the 2006 Bowhead Management Plan.

Wildlife management in Nunavut continues to be a challenging endeavor. As in other years, the NWMB met that challenge in 2005-2006 with a combination of hard work, innovative management and co-operation with its co-management partners. Global warming, mining and other development activities, the growing list of species at risk –ensure that the challenges facing the Board remain. Nevertheless, as it moves forward, the NWMB remains fully committed to the ongoing achievement of its vision: conserving Nunavut wildlife through the application of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit and scientific knowledge.

The NWMB co-ordinates its functions and activities with the Regional Wildlife Organizations and the Hunters and Trappers Organizations to ensure communication and co-operation with the many communities of the NSA.

The NWMB seeks to identify, develop and bring to bear the best information and expertise in the formulation of its decisions. The Board recognizes the role and power of various sources of information and expertise, including but not limited to, resource users, community elders, traditional knowledge and modern science.

The NWMB operates in an open forum, informing the public and providing for public input and participation.

Board and Staff Changes

Board Members

Joseph (Joe) Tigullaraq was appointed as Chairperson of the NWMB Board by the Governor in Council, effective August 29, 2005. Joe has many years of government service in a progression of wildlife positions in several communities of Nunavut. He is well known and respected by the local and regional wildlife organizations as well as other wildlife partner organizations and government departments.

Pitseolak Alainga, a long time Board member of the Amarok Hunters and Trappers Association, in Iqaluit, a respected hunter and participant in local and regional wildlife issues, and nominee of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada, was appointed by Order-in-Council effective November 22, 2005.

Nick Amoutinuar's appointment as a Board member by the Kitikmeot Inuit Association, ended on September 30, 2005. Nick served the NWMB for the full 4-year term.

Makabe Nartok, was appointed as a Board member by the Kitikmeot Inuit Association, effective October 1, 2005, replacing Nick Amoutinuar. Makabe previously served as a Board member from 1997 to 2001.

Kevin McCormick was re-appointed by DOE Canada effective December, 2005.

Harry Flaherty was re-appointed as a Board member by Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. effective February 2006.

Robert Moshenko's term ended in February, 2006. We are waiting for this seat to be filled.

Staff

Joseph (Joe) Tigullaraq was appointed Chief Executive Officer in March, 2005. This position appointment is joined to his appointment as Chairperson of the Board. Joe comes from Clyde River and worked his way through progressive levels of responsibility in wildlife management positions in various communities of Nunavut.

Josee Galipeau resigned from the position of Wildlife Management Biologist effective August 2005. Josee worked for the Board for five years including acting in the (vacant) position of Director of Wildlife for several months before she departed to pursue other interests.

Erin Calder was appointed as Wildlife Management Biologist, replacing Josee Galipeau, effective August 2005. Erin comes from Ontario.

Joseph (Joe) Justus was appointed as Director of Wildlife, effective September 2005. Joseph also comes from Ontario.

NWMB Implementation Activities

During the 12 months, from April 1st 2005 to March 31st 2006, the NWMB continued to perform its core functions in a thorough and timely fashion and to ensure the continued maintenance of a model wildlife management system that has the confidence of the public, Inuit and Government. Set out below is a description of the twenty-six NWMB implementation activities undertaken during the 2005-2006 period. Under each general activity is a brief listing of specific results and achievements.

(a) Complete the development of an efficient and economical system for the long-term storage of and access to the Nunavut Wildlife Harvest Study Database.

- Arrangements are underway to locate a contractor to provide the best possible options for long-term storage and access to the database.

(b) With the original Wildlife Harvest Study now completed, make suitable arrangements to investigate Nunavut's future wildlife data collection requirements.

- A consultant was contracted to review requirements for a future Harvest Study in conjunction with the 10-year implementation contract negotiations.

(c) Continue the introduction of the *Total Allowable Harvest-Basic Needs Level-Surplus* (TAH-BNL-Surplus) management regime for particular stocks or populations of species in the NSA.

- The Board has written to all of its co-management partners to help clarify what uses the NLCA permits for inclusion in the calculation of BNLs;
- The Board has requested that the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) and Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. (NTI) participate in a working group with the NWMB to develop a policy for the implementation of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management system for fisheries in the Nunavut Settlement Area (NSA); and
- The Board has made arrangements to publicly consider and potentially approve in the spring of 2006 the proposed TAHs and BNLs in the draft Wildlife Regulations and Orders made pursuant to Nunavut's new *Wildlife Act*.



(d) Pursuant to the principles of conservation, and in conformity with the development and initial introduction of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management regime, make appropriate decisions with respect to maintaining, establishing, modifying or removing TAHs, quotas or other restrictions on wildlife harvesting in the NSA.

- The Board approved a level of commercial char harvesting of 2,000 kgs. in Kingnait Fjord, near Pangnirtung;
- The Board has approved various gear restrictions for fish allocations within the NSA;
- The Board recommended that the co-management partners attend a meeting to resolve the process for establishing TAHs and BNLS as soon as possible for the arctic char test fishery in Pond Inlet;
- The Board approved the closure of beluga hunting in the Area of Equal Use and Occupancy around the Sleeper/King George Islands; and
- The Board approved Government of Nunavut, Department of Environment (GN DOE) recommendations for polar bear TAHs for 12 populations, in two phases. In September, the Board authorized the allocation of 50% of the polar bear tags. In November, after the NWMB had formally confirmed the levels of TAH under the Polar Bear MOUs for 2005-2006, the final 50% of the tags were released.

(e) In collaboration with the Government of Nunavut and NTI, arrange for an independent review of Nunavut's Polar Bear management system.

- A contract was arranged to develop Terms of Reference (TORs) for a *Polar Bear Management Independent Review*; and
- A committee was subsequently formed pursuant to the TORs, and is developing appropriate recommendations for consideration by the NWMB and its relevant co-management partners.

(f) Provide advice to DFO concerning commercial shrimp, turbot, shellfish and other marine species allocations in Zones I and II.

- The Board recommended that the DFO Minister provide an additional allocation of 400mt of turbot in Division 0A in 2005;
- The Board approved a joint plan led by the Canadian Association of Prawn Producers to conduct research on the extent and location of the shrimp resource in Shrimp Fishing Areas 0, 1, 2 and 3;
- The Board recommended that, for 2006 only, DFO maintain the status quo from the 2005 fishing season with respect to existing commercial marine turbot and shrimp allocations in Nunavut's offshore waters;
- With respect to potential increases in regional turbot or shrimp allocation levels for 2006, the NWMB recommended to DFO that all applications be evaluated pursuant to the Board's existing commercial fisheries allocation policy;
- The Board recommended to the DFO Minister an overall 5,000mt increase in the Total Allowable Catch (TAC) of turbot in NAFO Divisions 0A + 1A, starting in 2006; and
- The Board recommended that Canada claim a minimum 59% share of the 0A + 1A TAC, and that the entire Canadian TAC in Division 0A be exclusively allocated to Nunavut.

(g) Equitably allocate Nunavut's share of commercial shrimp, turbot, crab, sea urchin, kelp and other quotas among eligible fishers and hunters.

- In addition to the 4,000mt of turbot already allocated in Division 0A for 2005, the NWMB allocated another 200 mt within the NSA and another 200 mt to the offshore;
- The Board prepared an initial revised draft commercial marine fisheries allocation policy;

• The Board directed that the groundfish licence for NAFO Sub-Area 0 be assigned to the Baffin Fisheries Coalition for the 2006 fishing season;

• The NWMB maintained existing commercial turbot and shrimp allocations for 2006 in the marine waters adjacent to Nunavut; and

• The Board issued a public notice to fishers to apply for the new (2006) 2,500 metric tonne turbot allocation in Division 0A.

(h) Issue – in collaboration with DFO and NTI – a report concerning the 2005 five-year review of the community-based management system for beluga whales, and continue to implement/monitor the system.

- A five-year report on beluga Community-Based Management was completed and issued in the spring of 2005;
- On April 26th 2005, the NWMB issued a series of decisions and recommendations – based upon the report - to the DFO Minister; and
- NWMB staff continued to implement and monitor the system throughout the year.

(i) Continue to implement/monitor the five-year renewal (2003-2007) of the community-based management system for narwhals.

- Staff continued to monitor CBM for narwhals during the summer months;
- The NWMB held two co-management agency meetings to review the CBM program in November and January;
- The NWMB approved a request from Kugaaruk to carry over 50% or 13 tags from its unharvested 2005 allocation for use in the 2006 hunting season;
- The NWMB approved the carry over of 7 narwhal tags for Arctic Bay for the 2006 hunting season;

- The Board approved the carry over of 5 narwhal tags for Gjoa Haven for the 2006 hunting season;
- The Board approved an increase in the harvest of narwhal to a total of 75 for the Gulf of Boothia stock; and
- The Board did not approve a request from the Arviq HTO to increase its narwhal harvest from 72 to 108.

(j) Subject to the ongoing development and implementation of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management regime, continue to allocate quotas for professional, sustainable walrus sport hunting ventures.

- A call for applications for walrus sport hunting was issued in October; and
- The Board approved a total of 58 walrus sports hunts for the 2006 season.

(k) Continue to develop appropriate policies and strategies to document Inuit Qaujimagatuqangit (IQ) and to identify priority IQ needs, and continue to promote the inclusion of both IQ and modern science in all aspects of wildlife management.

- Plans were made to hold a workshop with the co-management partners during the current fiscal year, in order to discuss and commence the development of policies and strategies for an effective IQ program; and
- Plans for the workshop were further developed during the year. However, because of scheduling difficulties, the workshop itself was postponed until early in the 2006-2007 fiscal year.

(l) Make appropriate decisions with respect to the approval of plans for the management and protection of particular wildlife or wildlife habitats.

- Discussions at the staff level were held with the BQCMB with regards to habitat protection of caribou calving ground areas of these herds due to heavy mineral exploration/development;

- The NWMB continues to work with the GN DOE to finalize and approve proposed High Arctic Peary Caribou Management Plans;
- The NWMB approved the Naujaat Aviq (Bowhead Whale) 2005 Hunt Plan, and a successful hunt was carried out in Repulse Bay in August;
- The Board approved the 2006 Bowhead Management Plan; and
- The Board decided to approve the Quttinirpaaq National Park draft management plan.

(m) Continue to provide guidance and advice on wildlife management and research priorities.

- Staff reviewed progress reports for all projects previously funded by the NWMB and considered research priorities in reviewing new-year applications for funding; and
- The Board approved the Northern Shrimp Research Foundation (NSRF) request to conduct a shrimp test fishery inside the NSA in NAFO Division 0B, and to recommend support for the offshore portion of the research in 0B.

(n) Continue to evaluate Government and non-government Research Funding Proposals, and to provide funding to researchers from the *Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust and the NWMB Studies Fund*.

- At the Board's April 2005 meeting, the Board reviewed and approved twenty-one Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust (NWRT) projects for a total of \$730,700.00;
- At the same meeting, the Board also approved nine NWMB Studies Fund Research proposals, for a total of \$234,500.00;
- The Board decided to approve funding in the amount of \$85,000 towards three projects, originally set aside for further information, from the NWRT funding requests for 2005/2006;

- The Board approved up to \$20,000 to facilitate the completion of an independent comprehensive offshore fishing review (*Organizational and Performance Review of Nunavut's Offshore Fishing Industry*) prepared for the GN;
- At the NWMB's March 2006 meeting, the Board reviewed and approved eighteen NWRT projects for a total of \$581,835.00; and
- At the same meeting, the NWMB also approved five NWMB Studies Fund research proposals, for a total of \$121,540.00.

(o) Continue to monitor relevant wildlife research conducted by government and others, through review of wildlife research permits and reports.

- Staff reviewed all wildlife research permits issued by government departments; and
- Staff also reviewed progress reports for all research projects funded by the NWMB.

(p) Continue to ensure that wildlife research data and results from projects funded by the NWMB are made available to the public and encourage others to do likewise.

- All wildlife research project reports continue to be added in a timely manner to the Nunavut Wildlife Resource Centre libraries, and are available for public use.

(q) Continue to attend consultations between Canada and Greenland on shared wildlife stocks, and continue to work with administrative agencies and aboriginal peoples from other land claims areas concerning shared wildlife stocks.

- Staff attended an October 11-16 meeting of the Canada/Greenland Joint Commission on Conservation and Management of Narwhal and Beluga Scientific Working Group held in Nuuk, Greenland; and
- Staff also attended a DFO inter-jurisdictional meeting on beluga in Kuujuaq, QC.

(r) Play an appropriate role in the negotiation of inter-jurisdictional polar bear management agreements.

- Although the NWMB remains prepared to play an appropriate role, no meetings have been held to date; and
- The NWMB has continued a watching brief on this issue.

(s) Continue to provide funding to the RWOs and HTOs.

- The NWMB continued to provide quarterly payments during the current fiscal year. However, the RWOs recently formed an administrative secretariat (the Nunavut Inuit Wildlife Secretariat – NIWS) to assist them to improve the administration of all the RWOs and HTOs. Arrangements were made for payments from the NWMB to be provided to the NIWS for the RWOs and HTOs.
- The Board also approved a request from the NIWS for special assistance in the amount of \$160,000.00 for HTO accounting work and financial/administrative coaching.

(t) Continue to communicate and work in cooperation with HTOs, RWOs, NTI and Government Departments, and with other institutions of public government - including other members of the Nunavut Marine Council - concerning land and resource management issues affecting Nunavut.

- The NWMB participated in the three RWO AGMs; and
- The NWMB's Chief Operating Officer is in regular contact with his counterparts in the other Institutions of Public Government, and with his counterparts among the Board's co-management partners.

(u) Continue to work closely with Government and Inuit in ensuring that new and amended legislation affecting Nunavut recognizes and respects land claims agreements and the jurisdictions of land claims bodies (e.g. progress in development of the *Nunavut Fisheries Regulations*, as well as Regulations and Orders required pursuant to the territorial *Wildlife Act* and the *federal Species at Risk Act*).

- NWMB staff has commenced participation in consultation sessions with the RWOs and HTOs - regarding the new Nunavut Wildlife Regulations and Orders - during October and November, prior to formal enactment by the Nunavut Government;
- The NWMB held informal hearings, in November, into the proposed TAHs and NQLs under the new Regulations and Orders; and
- The Board made plans, in consultation with its relevant co-management partners, for a full public consideration in the spring of 2006, at an NWMB meeting, of the proposed TAHs and NQLs in the draft Regulations and Orders.

(v) Where required by new legislation affecting Nunavut wildlife, commence implementing relevant aspects of that legislation (for instance, the *Species at Risk Act*, the *Nunavut Wildlife Act* and the *Canada National Marine Conservation Areas Act*).

- The NWMB's Chairperson and legal advisor participated in a meeting in October towards the development of a Bilateral Agreement between the Federal Government and Nunavut with respect to the *Species at Risk Act*;
- The NWMB has been actively involved throughout the year in the process of listing species under the *Species at Risk Act* and the NLCA; and
- The NWMB has been participating throughout the year at the staff level in the development of proposed recovery strategies for (potentially) threatened and endangered species in Nunavut.

(w) Move forward – in collaboration with the NWMB's co-management partners – in the development of a *Live-Capture Policy* for Nunavut.

- Nunavut's Wildlife Policy Advisory Committee (WPAC) has informed the NWMB that it is planning consultations with communities from across Nunavut concerning the development of a live capture policy. Once WPAC has completed those consultations, the NWMB will work with its co-management partners to finalize a consensus view on an appropriate policy.
- The Board continued a watching brief on this issue.

(x) Continue to maintain fisheries development as a priority issue – participating in many forums, including the Fisheries Co-management Partners Working Group (as requested), the Federal-Provincial Atlantic Fisheries Council Working Group and the Northern Shrimp Advisory Committee, as well as maintaining frequent communications and regularly attending meetings with DFO officials.

To date during this reporting period, NWMB staff have:

- Attended meetings with the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans to discuss various Nunavut Fisheries issues;
- Attended regular Fisheries Co-Management Partners Working Group meetings; and
- Attended a meeting with DFO officials on various developments within the Nunavut Fishery.

(y) Maintain communications with relevant government departments, other IPGs and Inuit organizations concerning global warming and persistent organic pollutants, as these issues affect Nunavut wildlife and habitat.

- NWMB staff has been in contact with the Polar Bear Technical Committee and the GN concerning the potential effects of climate change on polar bears and their habitat.

(z) Review and Approve Conservation Education funding requests.

- The NWMB approved a request from NTI for funding assistance to help upgrade bowhead whale harvesting equipment;
- The Board approved another NTI request for funding assistance to hold a harvesting equipment and methods workshop;
- The NWMB approved a request from DFO for a financial contribution to the proposed bowhead recovery planning workshop scheduled for April 2006; and
- The Board approved funding for the second phase of a project investigating gender and decisions in Arctic fisheries.

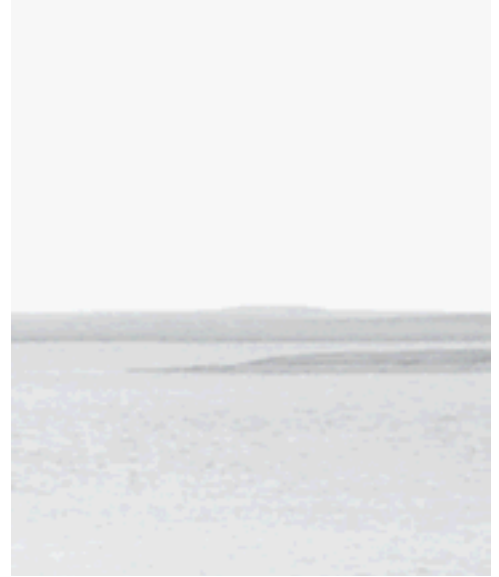



Notes to the Financial Statements

For The Year Ended March 31, 2006

1. Nature of the organization

The Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) is an institution of public government established pursuant to *An Agreement Between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada*, also known as the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement*. The NWMB is the main instrument of wildlife management and the main regulator of access to wildlife in the Nunavut Settlement Area (NSA). In addition, the NWMB identifies research requirements, funds research and carries out research in order to help maintain an effective system of wildlife management in the NSA. The Board also exercises an extensive advisory authority in the marine environment adjacent to the NSA.

The Board is exempt from income taxes under Sec. 149(1)(l) of the *Income Tax Act*.

2. Significant accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. The precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent on future events. As a result, the preparation of financial statements for the year involves the use of estimates and approximations that have been made using careful judgement. Actual results could differ from those estimates and approximations. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below:

(a) Revenue Recognition

The deferral method of revenue recognition is followed. Revenue is recognized in the year in which the related expenses are incurred.

(b) Financial Instruments

The Board's financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. It is management's opinion that the company is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments. Unless otherwise noted, the fair value of these instruments approximates their carrying values.

(c) Equipment

Equipment is recorded at cost. Amortization is provided annually at rates calculated to amortize the assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:



Notes to the Financial Statements

For The Year Ended March 31, 2006

1. Purpose And Nature Of The Organization

In 1994, pursuant to *A Contract Relating to the Implementation of the Nunavut Final Agreement*, the Government of Canada provided the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) with a single payment of eleven million dollars for the establishment of a Wildlife Research Fund. Its intended purpose was to provide funding for territorial and federal government departments to carry out wildlife research approved by the NWMB.

Upon that basis, the NWMB established the Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust, which was designated a Registered Charity in 1996. Its Trustees are the members of the NWMB. Since 1997, the Trust has provided an annual funding allocation, exclusively available to government departments. That allocation is administered by the NWMB, in order to address wildlife research priorities as identified by the NWMB.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. The precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent on future events. As a result, the preparation of financial statements for the year involves the use of estimates and approximations that have been made using careful judgement. Actual results could differ from those estimates and approximations. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below:

Fund Accounting

The Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions.

Financial Instruments

The Board's financial instruments consist of cash, marketable securities, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. It is management's opinion that the trust is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments. Unless otherwise noted, the fair value of these financial instruments approximate their carrying values.

3. Marketable Securities

Marketable securities are valued at the lower of cost and market value. The investment in marketable securities is used to fund research. The market value of these securities at March 31, 2006 is \$18,495,208 (2005 \$17,549,817).

4. Due To Nunavut Wildlife Management Board

The Trust is exempt from income taxes under Sec. 149(1)(f) of the *Income Tax Act*.

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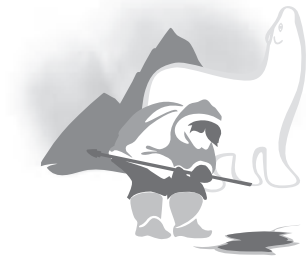


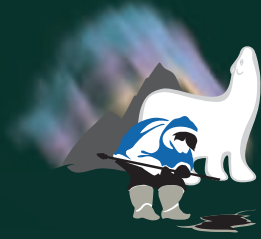
